Information presented here is accurate to the best our knowledge, but this document may contain inadvertent errors.

Based on issues raised either in separate correspondence or via these reports, we would anticipate seeking resolution with the Trustees through the TWG structure, the Trustee Council, or coordination with individual Trustees.

Thank you and please let us know if you would like to discuss any of the comments or status of the on-going cooperative NRD program. We also request that this Monthly Activity Report is placed into the Deepwater Horizon Administrative Record.

Deepwater Horizon Incident Monthly Report March 2011

Safety

- Inclement Weather Policy: BP added an addendum to our GCRO inclement weather policy that
 covers thunderstorms, lightening and tornados. These items are now required to be addressed
 in field safety plans and safety trainings.
- Deepwater Benthic Communities/Fish/Water Column-Plankton: Following two additional grounding incidents of deep tow equipment in March 2011, it was agreed that all work plans with a deep tow component will have an attachment/SOP describing safe deep tow procedures.

Key Decisions in March

- Birds: Trustees and BP will work to sign CWB addenda. Addendum 1 extends CWB study from January 1, 2011 through April 1, 2011; addendum 2 extends satellite tracking of brown pelicans and great egrets from April 1, 2011 through April 1, 2012.
- Birds: Non-breeding shorebird addendum (Willet telemetry) to be implemented cooperatively.
- Birds: Trustees and BP completed independent wintering open water waterbird (WOWW) plans.
- **Birds**: Trustees declined to participate in BPs colonial waterbird productivity study and in BP's helicopter-based May bird census.
- **Birds:** BP declined to participate in Wilson's sparrow oiling rate study (addendum to breeding shorebird study). BP sent the Trustees a letter for the administrative record regarding a path forward for secretive marsh birds on March 24, 2011 that outlined the reasons behind declining to participate and requested a technical meeting to discuss the SMB path forward.
- Birds: As noted in the February Monthly Report, Trustees agreed to designate a single, permanent point of contact to work with Brian Reilly to resolve several transmitter related issues. Awaiting response from Trustees.
- **Fish:** The Trustees submitted two draft work plans to BP in late March related to the comprehensive nearshore benthic program. BP is evaluating these plans.
- Water Column/Plankton: The Trustees and BP agreed to cancel the GRTS Bongo/Neuston survey. We will continue to collect shallow surface plankton data through the modified SEAMAP sampling programs.
- Natural Seep Program: BP presented two webinars on a projected seep program. The seep
 program is intended to include: AUV survey, aerial imagery to identify surface seep expressions,
 and associated sediment, biota and water column sampling.
- Natural Seeps: BP provided a draft Abandonment AUV survey to the Trustees on March 3.
- Megafauna: Mark Benfield provided presentation of previous results of megafauna analyzed as part of the incident. BP to provide to the Trustees, a work plan for additional deepwater megafauna data collection and analysis.
- Chemistry: BP provided a sediment fingerprinting protocol to the Trustees on March 24.

Pending Decisions

- Emergency Restoration: On March 10, BP received the Trustee revision to the Emergency Restoration Implementation Agreement. BP participated in multiple discussions through the month in order to resolve outstanding issues.
- **Birds:** Trustees to review/respond to draft integration agreement for Piping Plover work plan (provided November 23, 2010).
- Deepwater Benthic Communities: Trustees/BP to determine how best to integrate non-NRDA

- deep-sea cruise data into NRDA data analysis.
- Deepwater Benthic Communities: The Trustees are considering what level of participation to have on "Leg 2" of the Abandonment AUV Survey.
- Shoreline: Restoration Work Plan is pending from the Trustees since November 2010. Verbal request made by BP to NOAA in February to conduct the design in two phases, in order to initiate action in 2011. NOAA to discuss phased approach with other Trustees.
- Toxicity: A technical meeting is planned with Trustees April 2011 to follow up on the toxicity program that was provided in September 2010, and discussed with Trustees at Florida International University in October 2010.

Data Management

- Birds: BP has requested data from Trustee members of the Avian TWG for Glenn Ford overflights and secretive marsh bird overflights. Progress has been made and the data sets are nearing completion.
- Birds: BP and Trustees have discussed a path forward for data requested by BP, related to wildlife recovery efforts during the response.
- Birds: BP has requested missing capture sheets and carcass chains of custody filled out by BRI during the secretive marsh bird and colonial waterbird studies.
- **Birds:** BP received the software and video related to the secretive marsh bird overflights. The Trustees have committed to transfer the flight transcriptions.
- Birds: BP has transferred all BP-specific waterfowl data to the Trustees. The Trustees have committed to transfer all the Trustee-specific waterfowl data.
- Deepwater Benthic Communities: Data from the signed Deepwater Coral study has not been shared with BP. The raw data, and data which have been minimally processed with appropriate software, were requested on February 16, 2011, from the TWG and Dr. Ken Sulak. The Trustees are preparing a synopsis of the results, including dive tallies from 1997-2003, and intended to provide to BP by the end of March pending a decision on how best to provide the information to BP.
- Deepwater Benthic Communities: The Trustees issued a verbal early release of data from the Ron Brown/Lophelia II Cruise on March 25. BP is awaiting laboratory records supporting the verbal results of these samples.
- Marine Mammals & Turtles: Trustees to confirm the extent to which, if at all, the Marine Mammal Protection Act or other environmental statutes may limit sharing of cooperatively collected data. Trustees are requesting access to NOAANRDA database for BP and its representative TWG members.
- Marine Mammals: BP received draft Dolphin Health Assessment on March 3.
- Water Column: BP has had numerous requests from NOAA data managers for metadata/data associated with the NRDA Independent studies (i.e., BGOM cruises). In late March, BP and NOAA management discussed data sharing associated with independent studies conducted by either party.

Trustee Council/BP Communications in March

- BP Monthly Report: DOI provided a letter on March 7 concerning their appreciation for the information, however provided notice that the Trustees will provide no agreement or disagreement to the information sent. While we understand the response, we nonetheless encourage the Trustees to review these Monthly Reports-and provide comments. We also invite discussion in areas where resolution or action is required.
- NRD General: BP requested opportunity to meet with Trustees to discuss data interpretation and 2011 planning efforts (provided January 13, 2011). On February 22, received response from Trustees on BP request to meet. The dates mentioned coincide with the special SETAC

- symposium on the Deepwater Horizon incident, and therefore present a conflict.
- NRD General: BP was notified of a non-MC252 spill near Grand Isle, LA.
- Deepwater Management Meeting: A meeting was held on March 24 and 25 between BP and NOAA to discuss overall planning efforts for NRDA data collection for the remainder of 2011 for the deepwater area.
- OSAT II: On March 17, BP provided a letter to DOI concerning disagreement with certain conclusions of the OSAT II report as it pertained to the conservative nature of the potential for toxicity to shorebirds.
- Cooperative Assessment Agreement: Trustees provided a revised version of the assessment agreement to BP on March 17. BP is preparing a red line agreement to provide response.
- Restoration and Fisheries: BP provided a response to State of Mississippi concerning request for fisheries monitoring and potential restoration projects.
- Birds: On March 25, a letter was provided to DOJ concerning their denial of BP contracting with USDA for the Colonial Waterbird Reference Study.
- **Restoration:** BP received letter from State of Louisiana on March 25 concerning a request for oyster restoration funding. BP is preparing a response.
- Water Column: BP provided letter to Trustees on March 28 discussing concerns associated with sediment decontamination protocol.
- Dolphin Incidental Lethal Take: BP was notified by NOAA on March 31 of an incidental take of three pantropical spotted dolphins as part of a cooperative NOAA led cruise. NOAA is in process of developing additional mitigation measures.
- Data Management: BP requested meeting to discuss opportunities to align on a common database platform for both baseline work as well as injury assessment (provided January 13, 2011). A response from the Trustees has not yet been received.
- **DOI Funding:** On February 25, BP received a partial claim for NRD assessment costs of \$67,510,774.15. BP is preparing a response.
- Turtle Restoration: On March 22 and subsequently through the month, BP received and responded to a draft Emergency Restoration Turtle project.
- SAV Emergency Restoration: Trustees hosted a webinar on March 23 for BP SAV team
 members to highlight plan updates and provide detail on assessment methodologies. The
 Trustees transmitted the assessment areas in GIS format following the webinar. On March 28,
 BP received a revised SAV restoration plan.

Planned April Field Activities

- Birds: Cooperative implementation of non-breeding shorebird plan (Bird Study #5).
 Coordinated implementation of bald eagle plan and osprey productivity addendum (Bird Study #9, Part 2 and Part 3). Independent implementation of BP colonial waterbird productivity study and BP 2011 overflight census plans. Satellite data from brown pelicans and great egrets may be cooperatively obtained from ARGOS satellite though this entails no personnel in the field.
- Corals: N/A
- Deepwater Benthic Communities: Trustee proposed ROV cooperative work plan on the HOS Sweetwater should begin the week of March 21st. This plan will collect photographic/video imagery, sediment and near-bottom water samples in the vicinity of the MC 252 wellhead.
- **Deepwater Benthic Communities:** Sediment Profile Image (SPI) camera survey (cooperative study) on the Sarah Bordelon scheduled April 7 through April 22.
- Fish: Oyster Transition Plan Amendment surveys and Gulf Sturgeon river surveys continuing.
- Fish: A shakedown cruise of the Nearshore Benthic surveys is anticipated the last week of April.
- Human use: BP and Trustees to continue to move forward on potential cooperative data

- collection for aerial and ground counts.
- Marine Mammals & Turtles: The 2011 Kemps ridley nesting surveys in Texas to begin in April. Addendum to 2010 plan in final review stage.
- **SAV:** Fieldwork for the emergency restoration planning will be initiated in early April. Current field schedule would conclude field activities by end of April.
- Shoreline: Initiating spring 2011 shoreline coastal vegetation monitoring program in Louisiana, Mississippi, and Alabama.
- Water Column/Plankton: Initiate cooperative spring plankton sampling with MOCNESS-1 on the Nick Skansi and the MOCNESS-10 on the Meg Skansi.
- Water Column: The AUV survey of the region near the wellhead will continue. This plan has been shared with the Trustees and discussed in the Deepwater Benthic Communities TWG. The Trustees are considering whether "Leg 2" of the survey is best left as an independent (BP) study or a Cooperative Study. They have technical interest in the data, and BP has offered to share the date from the program. No decision has been made.
